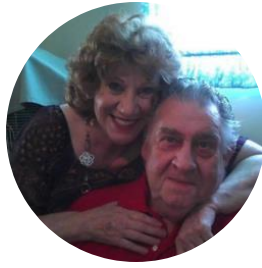

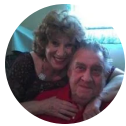
Janet K. Smith, age 82, of Amherst, passed away peacefully at her home, after a brief illness, on Saturday, February 5, 2022.

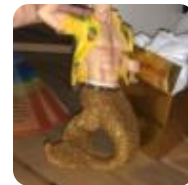

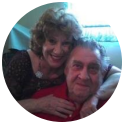
