# Raymond F. Incociati

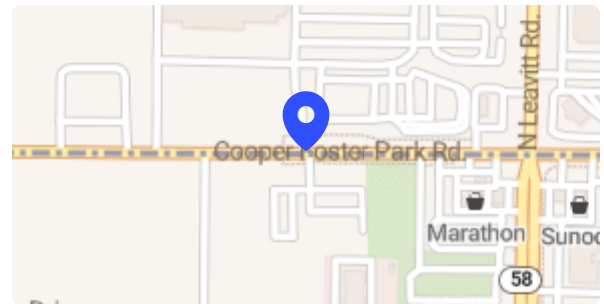

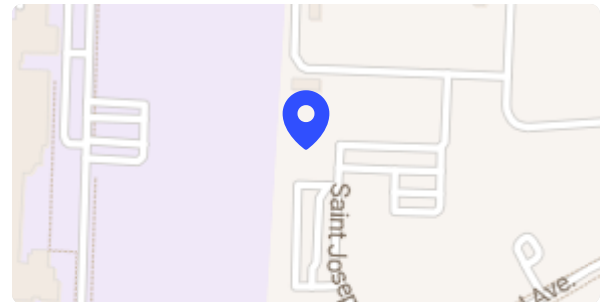

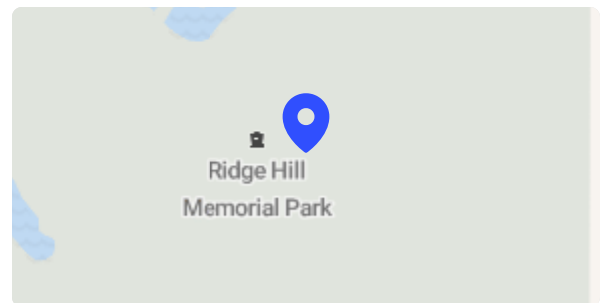
